Having one little problem now though! Now that I've stored the maximum amount of phones in the radio, I can't pair my new cell phone without deleting the old phones, and I can't access the bluetooth menu to delete the phones! Even getting rid of 12v constant will still retain Bluetooth memory. · Take your parking brake wire on you radio (should be light green) and install a toggle switch between the radio and a good ground. Then you will be able to access those pesky menus. Or you could actually connect it to your parking brake ground and accomplish the same thing. I did a switch because every once in a while my kid rides in my car with me and I can throw a DVD in to keep him occupied while I'm driving. Thanks, Mike · It has to be in your wiring. Either a bad ground or bad power lead or connector. Understand that it can check perfect but once you button it up it no longer works. This is really a bear to find and fix. Make sure when you insert the radio that you carefully position the wire so that they are not crush or have really tight bends nor put a lot of pressure on the connectors. Also on the off chance make sure all your connection to the Maestro are snug. · did you ever figure the problem? i have the same issue with the same exact setup 2016 wrangler · bought the same setup used, and now the 4200 is dead... Considering going to an alternate brand... · Check the faceplate contacts (both sides) for proper alignment. Clean them with alcohol and fine emery cloth At least that's what it always was for me. I have the Dasaita right now and I find it one of the best general information centers you can get. The audio is not quite as good as the traditional head units but I solved that issue with a sound processor. It of course did not work well with conventional amps. I had the 4200nex before my dasaita as well as the kenwood 9903s. Personally speaking if I was going to go back to a traditional headunit it would be the kenwood. I Found it a bit better than the pioneer.... personal preference though. The alpine restyle kit is a royal rip off. The "bigger" screen is not REALLY bigger. It has the same resolution as the standard 7 inch screen and is simply stretched so the video quality is worse than the 7 inch. · Datalink Maestro I have the datalink maestro and have never had any problems with it. The big thing to consider is that it has firmware updates just like the head unit. Also I have mine tucked under the cluster not near the top of the dash so heat should not be an issue for it. Only issue I have is I am on my 3rd faceplate due to getting caught out in pop up storms that we get in the Smokeys even though the wewather is calling for 0 % chance of rain...never fails... Gotta find a way to waterproof the button panel on the bottom of screen. Aftermarket head units rely on 12 volts through a "trigger wire" to turn them on (it's the red wire). Meanwhile the jeep harness does not have a red wire, so yes.

maestro creates a "red wire" for the head unit. Can Bus instructs maestro to turn the radio on and the maestro in turn makes the red wire go hot. If you think it's the Maestro which is causing the issues then you can try disconnecting the red wire from the maestro and connect it to any 12 volt source which is on in RUN or ACCESSORY, like for example the 12 volt power outlet on the dash.

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
